

# Using extended desktop (dual screen) with the Intel graphics driver

*Extended desktop* is the method for giving yourself more than one monitor and being able to display different content on both. This allows a larger working environment but also, when used with a projector for presentations, means that the presenter can see something different to his audience.

## Connections

First, all the relevant connections must be made:

1. Power the computer on
2. Power on the second monitor / projector
3. Plug in the second monitor / projector. If your speakers are turned on you should hear a chime to tell you the new connection has been detected.

## Enabling extended desktop



1. Find the Intel graphics driver icon in the system tray, to the left of the clock generally. This is highlighted in yellow above.
2. Right click on the icon
3. Select *Graphics Options*
4. Select *Output to*
5. Select *Extended desktop*
6. Of the 2 options, select *Notebook + Monitor* (see image below) – this will make the laptop screen the primary desktop and applications should open here first .
7. Once you've selected this option you should see your desktop wallpaper appear on the second screen / projector. You can now drag applications across the desktops as you see fit.
